

3 City Court Convictions Appealed By White

A. C. White served notice of appeal with the County Court yesterday seeking to overturn City Court convictions for third degree assault, driving without a license and resisting arrest that resulted in sentences totaling 14 months.

In an affidavit filed with the appeal notice, White, 46, of 383 Joseph Ave., maintained City Court Judge Sidney Z. Davidson twice committed reversible error in turning down defense motions to dismiss the charges against him.

It was also asserted the verdict was contrary to the weight of "credible evidence"

and contrary to law. White further argued the court should have required the prosecution to produce a report on White's arrest that policeman Vito D'Ambrosia made to his superiors.

During the May 2 trial, Reuben K. Davis, White's attorney, said he wanted the report to determine whether it would reveal any inconsistencies with D'Ambrosia's court account of White's arrest on Jan. 26. Judge Davidson ruled against Davis' motion, stating he did not believe D'Ambrosia's "personal file" should be made public.

White was arrested on charges of driving while in-

toxicated in Buchan Park, in addition to the charges disposed of in City Court. The felony drunken driving charge is pending in County Court.

White filed, but later withdrew, charges alleging undue use of force in affecting his arrest by Policemen D'Ambrosia, Gerald Gentile and Louis Genovese.

Later White served a claim against the city and the three patrolmen, demanding \$50,000 for injuries he claimed were suffered during his arrest as a result of the "wrongful and willful assault" on him by the three policemen.
